*Habersham Gold Mines.*—We have just been favored with a letter from Mr. R. R. WINFREY, the Superintendent of McGehee & White's mine, near the Chattahoochee in Habersham county. He writes that this mine is daily improving, and that the mines generally are doing a very safe business. "I commenced digging," he continues, "on the 26th March, and have made, up to this date [19th June] 3,740 pennyweights, with fifteen hands. From the 2d to the 5th of June inclusive (five days) I made ~~one thousand and one~~ pennyweights, which I think is the largest amount of gold obtained in this or any other country in the same time and with the same number of hands."

This is certainly a very fine business, and we wish the miners great success for their enterprising spirit.
