

John Ross, principal chief of the Cherokees, passed through this place last week, on his return home from Charleston, where he had gone, it is said, to obtain an injunction from Judge Johnson against the Gold diggers. We know not on what authority this rumor is promulgated.

In a short note in the Charleston Courier Mr. Ross says, that the statement that two of the Principal Chiefs of the Cherokee Nation had gone to see Gen. Jackson is incorrect. We expect Ross himself is under a mistake. Perhaps these Chiefs gave him the slip during his absence. Certain it is that two Indians, representing themselves to be in authority in the Cherokee Nation, presented themselves at Nashville for the purpose of seeing the President, and finding he had gone to Franklin, followed him thither. This fact we learn from several of the Nashville and other Tennessee papers.
