

PROCLAMATION.

STATE OF GEORGIA:

By his Excellency *GEORGE R. GILMER*, Governor
and Commander in Chief of the Army and Navy of this
State, and of the Militia thereof.

WHILEAS thousands of persons have entered upon the lands of the State, in the occupancy of the Cherokees, and are now, and have been for some time past, employed in taking great quantities in value of gold therefrom—And whereas this state of things was unforeseen by the Legislature, and therefore no laws have been passed for the prevention thereof—And whereas the powers vested in the Executive Department by the Constitution and laws do not sufficiently enable the Governor to remove or restrain such trespassers—It is therefore considered that an extraordinary occasion has occurred for convening the General Assembly of the State at a period earlier than that prescribed by law—I have therefore thought fit, and by virtue of the power in me vested by the Constitution, do hereby require the members of each House of the General Assembly of this State, to convene at the State House in Milledgeville, on *Monday the eighteenth of October next*, then and there to deliberate and decide on such matters as the public welfare may render necessary.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State at the State House in Milledgeville, this twentieth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty, and of American Independence the fifty-fifth.
