

Because, he is doing every thing in his power, to get the Cherokees off; and as he, and the President are very friendly, there is no doubt he will succeed very shortly. He has lately got the President's consent to have books opened in the Nation, to receive the names of those, willing to emigrate; and as the Cherokee laws are now broken up in the Nation, and the Indians will not now be afraid of their chiefs, because the Georgia laws protect those who put down their names, from all harm; the greater part, if not the whole, will no doubt, soon go away with their families. And here, you may see the necessity of keeping Mr. Lumpkin out as Governor; because, as I have shewn you, he says that the Cherokees have a right to make what laws they please; and mind you, he said this only three years ago; now, if he is elected Governor, he must, according to his own principles, permit them to do so; and then as the people of the Nation, generally will be as they were last year, afraid of their own laws, so called, but which it is well known, a few cunning chiefs make, what use will be Gen. Jackson's consenting to have the books opened? Not the least; not a single Indian will dare to put his name down; and we shall have them fastened upon us, as long as Lumpkin is Governor:

Because, it is not true, that he has treated the Missionaries cruelly, or that he has given orders to that effect. The severity the Missionaries suffered, was the work of the Guard, not his, and for it Col Nelson will have to answer; IF the account, indeed is correct, that we see in the newspapers. The Governor however, has ordered an enquiry into the matter; this is all that he can do. You will see the Rev. John Howard's letter, published on the subject; he says he is perfectly satisfied with the Governor's conduct, and calls him "a wise and humane benefactor:"
