

Strong reasons exist for believing, that, in the last few days, a caucus has been held at ledgeville with the view of expelling from and power such leaders of the Troup party have dared to express dissatisfaction at the policy of Governor Gilmer and declined subscription to the new ultra principles.

It is currently reported and commonly believed, that, in accordance with the fiat of that body, Colonel Robert A. Beall, of Twiggs county, is a candidate for the vacancy in Congress caused by the election of Mr. Lumpkin to Executive Chair; that Lott Warren Esq. of Twiggs county, offers for the judgeship of the Southern Circuit in opposition to Judge Clayton and that Charles Dougherty Esq. has resolved as one of the representatives elect of Hall county, in order to oppose Judge Clayton for judgeship of the Western Circuit. - Clay's overt act of mutiny is understood to be his voting, on the first Monday of the current year, for a *blank* ticket for governor, and his having called on some of his political associates to do business that he did not vote for Gilmer. It is also said that Judge Harris, of Walton county, will compete with Clayton and Dougherty.

In addition to the foregoing, it is asserted, what we deem good authority, that Dr. C. E. Haynes, of Hancock county, is a candidate for the vacancy in Congress, and that W. C. Dawson Esq. of Greene county, will present himself for the same station.

It is surmised, that Governor Gilmer has brought forward in opposition to the Hon. William H. Crawford and Colonel Nathan C. Sayre for the judgeship of the Northern Circuit.

Should the preceding intelligence be correct, the candidates will be for

*Congress*--Dr. Charles E. Haynes, Colonel Robert A. Beall, and William C. Dawson.

*Southern Circuit*--Howell Cobb, Thaddeus Holt, and Lott Warren.

*Western Circuit*--Augustin S. Clayton, Thomas W. Harris, and Charles Dougherty.

*Northern Circuit*--Hon. William H. Crawford, Colonel Nathan C. Sayre, and Hon. George Gilmer.
