

*Congress.*—Our advices from Congress up to the 15th inst. present little either useful or attractive to the general reader. In both branches, the principal topic of discussion still is the removal of the deposits. The final settlement of the question seems to be yet far distant. The following extracts from proceedings in the House of Representatives, relate to such local matters as will be most interesting to our patrons.

Mr. Clayton, of Georgia, presented the memorial of certain pensioners of Georgia, praying the establishment of a Pension Agency in the town of Milledgeville.

Also, a petition to exempt from duty rail road iron intended for certain rail roads about to be established in the State of Georgia; which petitions were appropriately referred.

Mr. Gilmer submitted the following resolution which, by the rules, lies one day on the table:
