

At this moment, when a surplus of money has been declared to be in the Treasury, to an amount singularly contrasting with the predictions of the opponents of the Distribution Bill, and far exceeding the most sanguine anticipations of its friends, the Letter of Judge CLAYTON, of Georgia, which we have copied into the preceding page, will be found to be of considerable interest. He is not only not opposed to further distribution, if there be further accumulation of revenue beyond the amount required for the necessary purposes of Government, but he is of opinion that the States have a legal title to *all* the proceeds of the sales of public lands in the territory Northwest of the Ohio, and could recover them from the United States if there were any Court in which such a case could be impartially tried.
