

## THE CHEROKEES.

We are informed by the Milledgeville papers, that nine companies of mounted volunteers have been organized under the authority of Gov. Gilmer, and received orders to ren-

deztvous forthwith at different points in the Cherokee country. "Of these, two are from Gwinnett, commanded by Captains Garmany and Tuggle, two from Hall, commanded by Captains Buffington and Dorsey, one from Franklin, commanded by Captain Bond, from Walton one, commanded by Capt. Means, from Habersham one, commanded by Capt. Cleveland, with two others, commanded by Captains Derrick and Faris. Two other companies, we understand, will in a few days follow those already in the service."

We also learn that our townsman, Gen. King, has received orders to hold himself in readiness for a call to the up-country, to take command of the Brigade from Georgia.
