The Board proceeded to the choice of six fit persons to sign and number the Bills of Credit to be emitted, agreeable to an Act of the General Assembly of the 14th of August last past, when Thomas Napier, Thomas P. Carnes, William Steele, William Moss, William Daniel, and Joseph Jackson, Esquires, were elected.

*Ordered,* That Thomas Napier, and Thomas P. Carnes, Esquires, do sign and number the denominations of Twenty and Ten shillings; and that William Steele, Esq. do sign and number the Five shillings, William Moss, Esq. Two shillings and six-pence; William Daniel, Esq. One shilling, and Joseph Jackson, Esq. Six-penny.
