V this Board, that the continuing of the fmall pox in the town of Augusta, has become a ferious confideration with the inhabitants thereof, it is therefore

Ordered, That no Physician or other perfon shall inoculate or ingraft, or cause to be inoculated or ingrafted, with the difeafe, commonly called the fmall-pox-any person as aforesaid within the limits of the corporation, under the penalty of five-pounds and no perfon or perfons fall bereafter come within the corporation to be inoculated, or ingrafted, with the fmall-pox, or being inoculated, or ingrafted with that difeafe shall hereafter come within the faid limite, to be attended or cured, under the penalty of three pounds for each and every offence if committed by a white person, or if by a negroe, or flave, fuch negroe or flave, fo offending shall, and may be fold for any terms not exceeding fix months, to d fray or raife the faid fine, or be punished with thirty-nine firiper, well laid on, on his or her bare back, with a cowikin, unlefs fuch fine be fo paid, and the owner of fuch flave shall be liable to the payment of fuch fine, unless such owner will declare, on oath, that the faid offence was committed without his, her, or their knowledge, or approbation.
