

# Executive Department,

Louisville, 18th June, 1802.

A RESOLUTION in the words following, to wit:

“RESOLVED, That his Excellency the Governor be and he is hereby authorized and requested, to pursue such measures as in his judgment may most effectually ascertain, and collect, all just claims which the citizens of this State may have against the Creek Nation of Indians; which said claims, shall, before they are exhibited, be duly authenticated by the oath of one or more disinterested persons, taken and certified by any judge, justice of the peace, or clerk of the superior or inferior courts.” Having passed both branches of the legislature, and received the assent of the executive—it is

ORDERED, That all persons having claims against the Creek Nation of Indians, for property of any description by them taken or plundered, be and they are hereby required, to transmit the same as soon as possible to the executive department, authenticated in the manner by the afore recited resolution pointed out—and it is further

ORDERED, That the following certificate of Horatio Marbury, Esq. Secretary of State, be published in the several gazettes of this State for the information of the citizens thereof:

“Errors in the Printed Laws of 1801.

“IN the act explanatory of justices courts, page 46, line the 11th from the top, after the word “seem,” leave out the word “not.”

“In the tax act, page 109. line the 8th from the top, after the word “quarter,” for “cents” read “mills,” and then they will agree with the originals.
