AN ACT authorizing the electors in the feveral counties in this state, to elect four persons to represent them in the House of Representatives of the United States.

WHEREAS by the late enumeration of inhabitants of the United States, this state is entitled to four members in the House of Representatives of the United States:

Be it therefore enacted, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Georgia, in General Assembly met, That at the general election which shall be held for members of the State Legislature, on the first Monday in October next, and at any second general election, the electors at such elections, shall be entitled to vote for four persons to represent this state, in the House of Representatives of the United States, under such rules and

regulations as are prescribed by the election laws of this state now in sorce. ABRAHAM JACKSON, Speaker
