A Proclamation.

WHEREAS, I have received official information from the Sheriff of Richmond county, that a certain WILLIAM CHAMPION, confined under a charge of murder, in the common jail of said county, did, on the 27th ultimo, make his escape therefrom—

I HAVE THEREFORE THOUGHT FIT, to issue this my Proclamation, offering a reward of ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS to any person or persons who will apprehend the said William Champion, and him safely lodge in some secure jail within this state—And I do hereby charge and require all officers, civil and military, belonging to this state, to be aiding and assisting in apprehending and securing the said offender, so that he may be brought, by due course of law, to answer to the charge alledged against him.

Given under my hand, and the Great Seal of the State, at the State House in LOUISVILLE, this fifth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and three, and of the Independence of the United States of America the twenty-seventh.
