Board of Trustees.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN.

Resolved, That in future no drafts upon the Treasurer shall be valid unless the same be presented to the Treasurer for his acceptance within thirty days, and be by him accepted, and entered in a book, and that it be his duty to accept and enter the same accordingly—provided, that it appear that the amount drawn for be due the person in whose favor the draft is given. And wherever a person in whose favor a draft has issued, shall be indebted to the Board, the Treasurer shall except for the amount of the balance only.

Resolved, That the Treasurer of this Board be requested to give notice, in the public papers, for the space of six successive weeks, notifying all persons possessing orders or drafts upon the Treasurer to produce the same to him, on or before the 25th day of December next, the said orders or drafts may be accepted and chequered in conformity to a resolution of the Board, passed this day—7th Sept. 1810.
