Edw. Swann, sen. } **RULE NISI.**

UPON the petition of Peter Brown, setting forth that Edward Swann, sen. on the 12th day of December, 1818, executed and delivered unto your petitioner, his certain deed of mortgage, of, in and to all that tract or parcel of land, whereon the said Swann now lives, laying on the waters of Light-wood-log creek, in said county, containing 140 acres, more or less, which was mortgaged to secure the payment of the sum of 200 dollars: Whereupon, on motion of Green W. Smith, attorney for the petitioner— It is Ordered, that the principal, cost and interest, due on said mortgage, be paid into court, within twelve months from this date, otherwise the equity of redemption in, and to the mortgaged premises, will be from thenceforth forever foreclosed and barred, and other proceedings take place thereon, according to the Statute in such cases made and provided: And be it further Ordered, That a copy of this Rule be published in one of the Gazettes of this state, at least once a month for the space of twelve months, or served on the mortgager, at least six months previous to the time the money is directed to be paid—9th March, 1821.
