

Georgia, Habersham Superior Court, February Term, 1822.

The Grand Jury for the said county, make the following presentments :

We present William England of said county, for feloniously cutting several saddles and bridles on the night after the first Monday in January last, at Habersham court-house, to-wit :—one saddle, the property of Allen Turpin, one saddle and bridle, the property of Waddy Hamilton, also Thomas Goss's, John Cox's Abraham Leathers's, George Clark's and some others, at the same time and place—Witness, Allen Turpin John Sanders, and Edward Adair.

We likewise present John Williams of said county, for feloniously cutting the coat of Isaac Dixon, while the same was on the said Dixon, on the ninth day of this instant, and for other abuse committed by the said Williams, at the house of Wley Harbin in said county—Witness Edward Adair, John Blithe, and John Stephens.

We present as a grievance of no small magnitude to our county, the delay of the commissioners in designating a permanent site for the public buildings in said county, as being the cause of serious inconveniences in the administering of public justice in the county, and protracting the laying out and opening many useful roads, and the permanent repairs of others so essential to every county, and particularly one situated *in our* is.

We present as a grievance of the most alarming nature, to the free citizens of this state in general, and to those who reside in the frontier counties, in particular the non existence of a statute prohibiting the admission of the natives of the different nations of Indians from being evidences in our courts of justice, where the free white citizens of the United States are concerned, and earnestly recommend to our Legislature at its next session, the consideration of the same.

We likewise present David Denmore of said county, for receiving stolen clothing and keeping the same in his house without giving information of the same until searched for by a public officer, being legally authorized to search for the same—Witness, Jeremiah Taylor, Moses Mulky, Gilla Franklin, Loyd Meroney

We return our most sincere thanks to his honor Judge Clayton, for his close attention in the faithful discharge of his official duty during the present term
