

LEGISLATURE OF GEORGIA.

IN SENATE.

Monday, Nov. 12.

On motion of Mr. Clayton, of Clark—
Resolved, That the committee on the State of the Republic be instructed to inquire into the right and propriety of appropriating money from the public treasury of the U. States, by Congress, for the support of the Colonization Society, and to report to this Legislature whatever may be expedient in relation to said subject

Mr. Davies called up the following resolution, which was read and agreed to:

Resolved, That the Senators and Representatives of this State in the Congress of the United States, be requested to use their exertions to procure the passage of an act of Congress providing for copying the documents and papers in the Plantation office, and other public offices, in England, relating to the early history of Georgia.

Notices for leave to report bills, viz:

By Mr. Crawford—To compensate Petit Jurors, and for other purposes.

By Mr. Hicks—To make the decision of the Superior courts of this State final and conclusive in all cases of divorces.

By Mr. Ezzard—To repeal so much of the militia laws now in force in this State, as requires the senior officer present at all courts of enquiry, to preside.

Mr. Coffe laid on the table the following resolution:

Resolved, That a committee on the part of the Senate be appointed, to join such committee as is already appointed from the House of Representatives, for the purpose of laying out a new county out of the counties of Gwinnett, Walton, DeKalb and Newton.

A communication was received from the Governor, informing the Senate that the Surveyor General had on oath presented to the Executive Department information of errors having been committed in the survey of the first district of the 2d section of the territory embraced by the Treaty of the Indian Springs, and submitted the subject for its consideration.

Notices for leave to report bills, viz:

By Mr. McDougald—To create two additional military brigades, and one division of militia.

By Mr. Sellers—For the relief of persons in certain cases who have purchased any part of the state's interest in lots which have been condemned as fraudulently drawn within the counties of Bibb, Houston, Crawford, Monroe, Upson, Pike, Henry, Fayette, DeKalb and Newton.

By Mr. Anderson—To alter and amend the act passed 15th December, 1809, regulating the rates of tavern licences.
