

We have been informed from good authority, that some time in the month of September last, the Cherokee Indians, about thirteen in number, arrested a citizen of Habersham county, by the name of Jesse Stanval, under the pretence of a violation of their laws; he was detained in custody nearly two days, and then was ordered to be bound, suspended by the wrists to a tree, and there to receive fifty lashes on his bare back, which was inflicted by four Indians with hickories almost equal to clubs, in a most barbarous manner. Under the operation of which, the individual was near expiring.

We understand for this conduct, Judge Clayton has issued a warrant against these Indians, to have them bound over to sa-

swer for the offence at the next Superior Court of Hall county, the same having been committed in that part of the Cherokee nation attached to that county, for the purpose of criminal jurisdiction. As the proper tribunal will have the case before it, it is our duty to say nothing about the individuals concerned, further, than to remark, that every one must perceive that those unfortunate people cannot reside where they are, without difficulties greatly interruptive of their own and our peace.—*Athenian of Nov. 3.*
