We recommend that a road be granted to Joseph Anthony and others, from Walker's meeting-house to Smerney's meeting-house, and from thence into the Augusta road, at or near Abraham Simon's, on the said road, provided they be not exempted from working on other roads; and that William Cole and George Hambleton, be Commissioners to lay out the same.
