We recommend that a road be opened from the Ten Mile Tree, on Allen's road, the nearest and best way to Finezee's stere; and that John Diamond, Joseph Staten, and Thomas Rutledge, be appointed Commissioners to lay out the faid road.

We present the Commissioners of the road leading from this town to Shanon's ferry, on Savannah river, for not keeping the fame in

repair.

We present John Brooks and Mavel Coo-

per, for living in adultery. .

We recommend that a road be granted to tofeph Anthony and others, from Walker's meeting-house to Smerney's meeting-house, and from thence into the Augusta road, at or near Abraham Simon's, on the faid road, provided they be nor exempted from working on other roads; and that William Cole and George Hambleton, be Commissioners to lay out the fame.
