

WHEREAS William Partin is now, and hath been since the eighth of June last past, confined in goal in the county of Washington in virtue of a *capias ad satisfaciendum* issued against him from and out of the Inferior Court of the county of Wilkes, at the instance of David Thurman: These are therefore to notify the said David Thurman and all other the creditors of the said William Partin, that I shall, as his attorney, move their Honors the Judges of the Superior Court, or one of them, at Chambers in Augusta, on the 27th day of September instant, that he, the said William Partin, be liberated from his confinement, in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly, entitled, "An Act for the relief of insolvent debtors," on his complying with the terms required of him by that Act, which he will then and there be ready to do.
