HEREAS William Partin is now, and hath been fince the eighth of June laft past, confined in goal in the county of Washington in virtue of a capias ad fatis" faciendum iffued against him from and out of the Inferior Court of the counts of Wilkes, at the inftance of David Thurman: are therefore to notify the faid David Thurman and all other the creditors of the faid William Partin, that I shall, as his attorney, move their Honors the Judges of the Superior Court, or one of them, at Chambers in Augutta, on the 27th day of September inftant, that he, the faid William Partin, be liberated from his confinement, in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly, entitled, " An Act for the relief of infolvent debtors," on his complying with the terms required of him by that Act, which he will then and there'be ready to do.
