

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 5, 1813.

Monday last being the constitutional period for the meeting of our Legislature, a number of the Representatives attended at their respective chambers in Milledgeville; but no house was formed on that day.

On Tuesday a quorum of both branches attended, when after taking the usual oath, the Senate made choice of Wm. Babcock, Esq. as their President, and Wm. Robertson, Esq. as Secretary. The House of Representatives elected Benjamin Whittlesey, Esq. Speaker, and Smith Clayton, Esq. Adj'ty. There a joint committee was appointed to wait on His Excellency the Governor, and inform him the Legislature was organized, who returned for answer that his communication would be held before them to-morrow forenoon, when both Houses adjourned.

We understand Thursday is set apart for the election of Governor, and that the candidates are the Hon. Peter Early, Genl. John Clark, and Col. N. Long.

On Saturday next, a Senator to Congress, the State Officers, Judges, &c. will be appointed.
