

PRESIDENT'S DINNER.

7. *Major General Andrew Jackson*—The hero of New Orleans, the brave defender of his country and savior of its injured honor. 2 guns, 3 cheers.

8. *Admiral Sir Isaac Hull and Madison*—They have withstood a storm of public obloquy, and it is thanks by their virtues and services, carry with them a nation's gratitude. 2 guns, 3 cheers.

9. *The Army*—Imperishable fame accompanies the star spangled banner. In the land war we coped with Britain on the ocean; now we hear of no search, no imprisonment. 2 guns, 3 cheers.
