

**Diary Entry for March 15, 1835, Salem, North Carolina, George H. Rodgers Travel Diary, University of Virginia Library, Special Collections, Charlottesville, Virginia**

March 15<sup>th</sup>

1835

During my stay at the above [mentioned?] place, I went to Salem a neat little ville about sixteen miles from the place<sup>1</sup> I boarded. This place is settled by Dutch, which a person could easily discover at first sight from its appearance. Judge Clayton of Georgia put up at the house where I boarded and staid all night together with his family and a gentleman from [Union?] South Carolina, a member of the House of Representatives. They were on their return from the City of Washington. ...
